Span Tops \$100 Million Mark

Span Construction & Engineering Inc., Madera, CA, is the first metal building contractor in the industry to attain \$100 million in steel purchases. With a history of steel sales in the millions of dollars that started in 1980, it is no surprise the company reached this milestone within 16 years under the direction of King Husein, president and CEO.

Husein grew up in Bombay, India, and received his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Bombay in 1969. Then, after having come to the U.S. later that same year, Husein earned his master's degree in civil engineering from Brigham Young

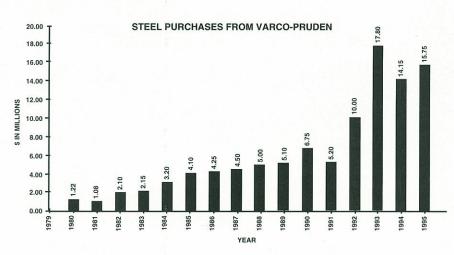

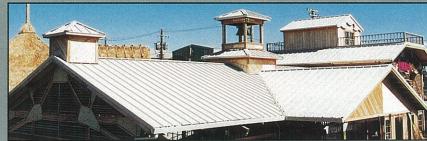

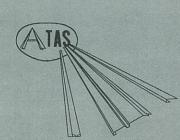

and engineering staff there to meet the needs of those customers. This shows those customers that we can service their needs. We feel we offer a competitive product, through all our divisions, with strong service and this is what builders are looking for.

MCN: Are NCI's products available literally throughout the U.S.?

Schulte: Yes. There are some regions where we are planning to improve our market presence, but we are currently servicing all of the states and several foreign locations.

George: There are also export opportunities, in the event that the U.S. building market slows down. We'll continue to work at developing this market and we keep getting better at it. Sales internationally have grown considerably in the past year.

We have a very supportive board of directors who know the industry and who help us a lot in these acquisition opportunities and expansions. They allow us to stay nimble and quick, and take advantage of opportunities that will enhance the company.

Since April we've also been training builders on our new computer pricing systems. The software is targeted to our builders in the A&S, MidWest and Metallic divisions. It is now capable of generating pricing and purchase orders and the next release will be able to do drawings.

We are also linked to the World Wide Web (www.ncilp.com), registered through NCI and the building divisions. Product information will be available through the Web,

where we will also be able to post information to the investment community.

MCN: Can we expect further acquisitions, or start-ups, of products that will complement NCI's building and components product lines?

Schulte: I think we'll digest some of the purchases and additions that we've made. And there is room for some mini plants. But over the long haul, yes, you'll see some more of this happen. We know metal buildings and we'll match our staff with anyone in the metal building industry.

MCN: Despite being a publicly-held company you appear to be committed to continuing your entrepreneurial spirit.

Schulte: That's right. Our management and employees still own a significant portion of the company, so we're going to continue to make decisions to grow the company and we'll act on those decisions.

We expect the rest of this year to be strong for NCI, and beyond that we are making plans to guard against any downturn that might be coming in the future. Our residential products, Express buildings, components and regional expansions are some of the things that will help us to offset a drop in building sales whenever that does eventually happen.

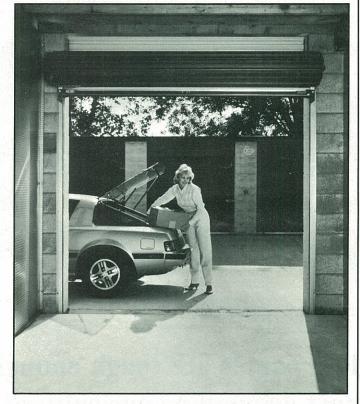

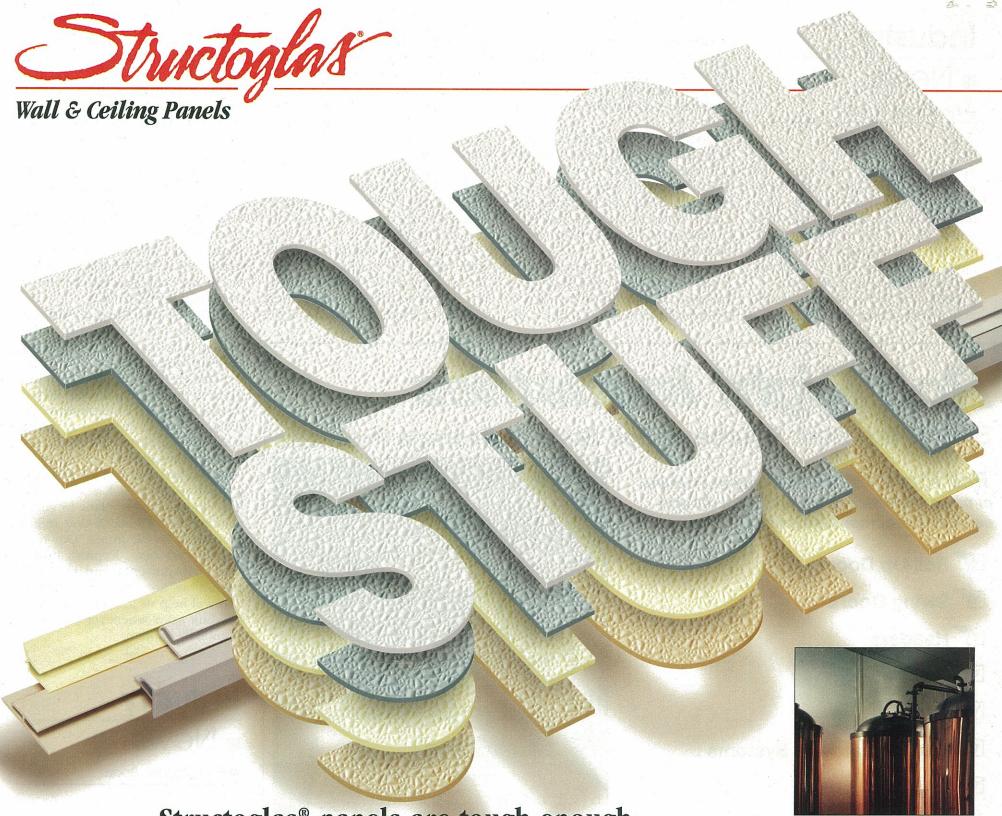
